Attendance

Good attendance is a necessary part of the educational process and is closely related to successful performance in school. When a student is absent, he/she misses the important interaction that transpires in the classroom. Connecticut state law requires parents, or other persons having control over the child, to cause their children to attend school regularly during the hours and terms the public school is in session. (See Policy 5115 and Regulation 5115A for truancy) In addition, Regional School District #10, through its Superintendent, will adopt and maintain procedures in granting high school course credit based on attendance standards, as well as grades.
